

Core Provision- Level 1 funding WAVE 1	
 Quality First Teaching Students in Key Stage 3 follow a curriculum of English, Maths, Science, RS, Humanities, ICT, PE, Music, Art, Drama, a Modern Foreign Language, Life Skills and PSHE Students in Key Stage 4 follow a curriculum of the core subjects including English, Maths, Science, RS and Humanities. They also continue with core PE and PSHE. Key Stage 4 students choose their options from a large list of subjects and qualifications include GCSE and BTEC options. Homework club runs 4 nights a week for all our SEND pupils Homework club for all other pupils runs across 2 nights per week 	 Students are assigned to a Tutor Group and have a Tutor who provides the first home-school link. The Tutor meets with the students each day in tutor time for a collective Prayer, where they are also available for all student concerns. The Tutor also carries out reviews of their progress. Each year group has a Head of Year who conducts assemblies and leads the Year group through the team of tutors, in all school events and monitoring of academic progress and pastoral issues. Students take part in school Masses, Liturgy's and retreats throughout the year.

Subjects are largely based in subject areas. Classes are taught on all three levels, including the old Convent building. The ground floor is fully accessible. There are no lifts to the second floor. All Students have access to appropriate seating and tables in all classrooms, including ICT facilities, if appropriate. All stairs accessible for student use have high contrast edging and hand rails. We have a lift which links our North and South Buildings

 Provision Map for sentence of Provision Level 2 Funding WAVE 2 Quality First Teaching Students at Key Stage 4 are guided through different pathways in their option choices in order to meet their needs, for example; Pathway A Students choose from a EBACCpathway. Pathway B students choose from a non-EBACC pathway. Highly able students are encouraged to do combined Science. Revision Classes run before and after school in the build-up to exams in all subject areas for students requiring support for target grades. Drop-ins operate most afternoons in all subject areas for catch-up opportunities. Key Stage 4 Subjects offer up to 6 week enhanced learning for students needing additional support in Key Stage 4. English and Maths interventions support students including; Literacy, Numeracy and Spelling groups and curriculum support groups in years 8-11. Science Club operates after school for Year7 Students. Instrumental and vocal Music sessions take place in lunchtime and afterschool to improve confidence and performance for all Year groups. 	Pastoral St Paul's operates a report card system where students may report to a tutor daily to support their learning. Students may be mentored in small groups according to need. Peer Support Mentors from Key Stage 4 work with students in Key Stage 3, and KS5 mentors work with KS4 students Careers advice is offered through a robust careers programme from Year 7 through to Year 13. 1:1 interviews in Year 10,11,1 and 13. Year 12 students begin their UCAS application process in Year 12 Multiple extra-curricular clubs run across every afternoon ranging from a variety of sports to debating club, chess club, Warhammer club and much more Games club tales place in a classroom every lunchtime SEND room open every morning before school, break and lunch as a quieter space
